



Mr. Armas Cravins II

Armas Cravins II, of Melrose, Wisconsin, passed away on Tuesday October 15, 2019 in North Bend, Wisconsin. Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday, November 2 at Saint Ann's Catholic Church in

Mallette, Saint Landry Parish, Louisiana. Burial will follow in Saint Ann's Cemetery.

Armas Cravins II was born at Worcester Memorial Hospital in Worcester, Massachusetts on December 3, 1986. He was one of two children born to Georges and Therese Cheryl [Giles] Cravins. He attended the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, where he graduated with degrees in Public Administration and Philosophy.

Prior to his family moving to Wisconsin in 1990, Armas lived in Massachusetts and Rhode Island. Armas worked in a number of jobs, most recently in sales for Century Link and the La Crosse Tribune.

Previously, he worked at the Walmart Distribution Center in Tomah, Wisconsin, and in construction, with a retaining wall company in La Crosse, Wisconsin.

Armas is survived by his parents, Dr. Georges Cravins and Therese Cheryl Giles; by his daughter, Anna-Madison Cravins; a son, Armas Cravins III; and stepsons Elijah and Zane Lockington of North Bend,

Wisconsin. He is also survived by one sister, Marie-Clarina Cravins, and two half-brothers, George Cravins and Jeremy Migner, as well as numerous cousins and aunts and uncles, most of whom live in New England, and south Louisiana. He was preceded in death by his daughter Patricia Maxine Cravins, and by his paternal grandparents, his maternal grandmother and several aunts and uncles.

Armas' interests included politics, 19th Century German philosophy, and cooking, especially Louisiana French cooking. As a college student, he actively engaged in local, state, and federal political campaigns, and was most active and instrumental in the Fall, 2010 Wisconsin election. Armas' passion for philosophy was particularly piqued by the

German existentialist philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche, whom he studied under Dr. Samuel Cocks of the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. For Armas, Nietzsche's Will to Power had very deep personal meaning, and great relevance to many of society's current issues.
