McArthur Tyler, a beloved father, entered eternal rest on Saturday, April 11, 2020 at Lafayette General Medical Center in Lafayette, LA at the age of 75.

McArthur 'Mac' Tyler was born on October 23, 1944 in Opelousas, Louisiana to the late Carlton Tyler and Roselean Bob Tyler. He was the fourth of eleven children. McArthur was wedded to Bernice Davis Tyler and from their union was blessed with two sons and three daughters: Todd, Shawn, Cher, Renee, and Jewel.

McArthur, a 1965 graduate of J.S. Clark High School, was a star running back of his high school team. He was a skilled craftsman, artisan, and extremely talented plasterer during his entire career. The pride of this work can forever be seen throughout Acadiana from the stately homes of River Ranch and Le Triomphe to many businesses, including the Lafayette Regional airport. His decorative handprint is eternally etched in stucco, plaster, and the ornate chimneys of Louisiana. 'Mac' treasured his family, valued hard work and venerated his Creole culture. His favorite past times were watching sports, his beloved Saints, and listening to Zydeco "la-la" music by radio on weekends.

McArthur was a devoted Catholic, who took his family to Sunday evening mass and taught his children their prayers for catechism. He was loved by his children, cherished by his brothers and sisters, revered by his many nieces and nephews, and respected by his peers. His wit, charm, storytelling, and joie de vivre will forever be missed.

McArthur leaves to cherish his memories, his wife of 56 years, Bernice Tyler of Lafayette, LA; two sons, Todd Tyler (Yvette) of Church Point, LA, Shawn Tyler (Tonya) of Lafayette, LA; three daughters, Cher Tyler of Lafayette, LA, Renee Calloway (Terrance) of Lafayette, LA, and Jewel Thierry (Jacobi) of Lafayette, LA; three brothers, Whitney Tyler (Irma) of Baton Rouge, LA, Joseph Tyler (Linda) of Opelousas, LA and Gilton Tyler of Round Rock, TX; two sisters Carrie Tyler of Houston, TX and Hilda McKissick (Kevin) of Round Rock, TX; eight grandchildren, four great grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.
