Obituary for Dr. Alexander Charles Marshall

Dr. Alexander Charles Marshall, age 94, of Opelousas, peacefully entered eternal rest on February 17, 2026. His long and faithful life stands as a testament to service, scholarship, creativity, and unwavering devotion to God and family.

Alexander Marshall began his life in Lafayette, Louisiana. He earned degrees from Grambling State University(B.S.), University of Denver(M.A.) and Bowling Green State University(Ph.D).Dr. Marshall was a pioneer in high school and college theatre. Dr. Marshall was an accomplished director whose work reflected depth, cultural insight, and a profound understanding of the human spirit. Through both stage and classroom, he used his gifts to uplift, challenge, and enlighten African American actors, actresses and playwrights. Dr. Marshall directed over 37 plays in his lifetime.

A proud veteran of the United States Army, Dr. Marshall answered his nation's call with honor and courage. Following his military service, he dedicated his life to education and the arts, becoming a respected professor in the Theatre Department at Dillard University. There, he inspired generations of students

with his wisdom, discipline, and passion for storytelling. He was a proud member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity incorporated.

Above all, Dr. Marshall was a man of steadfast faith. He served faithfully at Bellevue Street Baptist Church, where his presence, prayers, and commitment enriched the church community. His life embodied the Scripture he so deeply believed in a life rooted in service, love, and gratitude.

He was preceded in death by his father Alexander Charles Marshall, Sr. and mother Mintie Hall Marshall, brother Ralph Marshall and his beloved wife, Betty D. Marshall, with whom he shared a devoted and enduring partnership.

He leaves to cherish his memory his son, Rev. Brandon K. Marshall and wife Esther Marshall in Dothan, Al; his adopted daughter, Cathy Duncan Smith in Dallas, TX; his grandchildren, Brannette Leola Marshall in Birmingham, Al, Darius Smith in Austin, TX and Alexia Smith in Dallas, TX; and his foster children, Adrienne Washington and Ketrick Washington(Raven). His legacy also lives on in the countless students, colleagues, church members, family and friends whose lives he touched.

“ *A Living Legacy: Remembering Dr. Alex C. Marshall.*

In the early 1980's, I had the honor of serving as a faculty member at Hampton University (Hampton, VA) through the unwavering mentorship of Dr. Alex Marshall. During this period, he served as chair of the Speech Communication and Theatre Arts Department. Marshall didn't just see my potential; he commanded it to the surface. He had a way of hauling out the best in us, even when we couldn't see it ourselves.

As a result of his dynamic persona and treasure-trove of talent, anyone lucky enough to work with him excelled, and certainly his students. His dedication to Black Theatre wasn't just a career—it was a movement.

Marshall and I stayed in touch throughout the decades. When I spoke with him in December 2025, I was struck by his energy and how sharp he remained for a man in his 90s. It feels particularly poignant that he had agreed to share his journey for an oral history project proposed by a mutual friend. This was a testament to Marshall's legacy that remains legendary. For me, there is some comfort in the following quote:
