Mo, you helped to raise me for such a big part of my life. It's all the little things I will recall.. making us coffee long before mom probably knew I was drinking that at such a young age, teaching me to iron which became my little gift to you because I'd iron end up

ironing your work clothes sometimes, teaching me how to cook my first after school snack which was homemade hamburgers on the stove, identifying plants and caring for them, and even mowing the grass. I haven't attempted sewing but the matching outfits, bonnets and jumpsuits you made me were top of the line fashion. And the music we'd jam to has filled my life in so many ways... like you and I singing "Hit the Road Jack" "RESPECT" or "Stuck in the Middle." I didn't know what they were singing about but those were some of our jams. You never made me feel like I was too little to do something. And I was never too big for a kiss where you'd blow into my cheek to make noises. That was one of our things. Thank you for that. I'll cherish everything I have from you and of you, like my little pointy nose and my quick witted/hilarious responses. And thank you for my Momma, who is like you in many ways too. I'll keep you with me in every corner of my life and anywhere I go in this world. For 35 years of my life, I had one of the greatest loves of all. Thank you for loving me like you did. I love you Mo and that will be forever. You worked hard and fought even harder. Welcome to your better days.
