Gracie Garriett was born on September 22, 1943 to Doris and Oliver Garriett in Opelousas, Louisiana. She attended North Elementary where she first encountered the love of her life, Patrick Thompson at the tender age of five years old. While Patrick and Gracie certainly had eyes for one another, it would be sixty years before they were married and were able to spend 12 glorious years in a loving relationship.

Gracie was a loving mother, sister, grandmother, aunt, cousin, wife, mentor, professor and friend. She dedicated her life to helping others as a public health nurse in St. Louis MO, Ft. Lauderdale, FL and East St. Louis, IL. Gracie married Samuel Hutchinson, Jr in June, 1965. Although Gracie chose nursing as her profession, anyone who heard her angelic voice knew she could have been a professional opera singer. She shared God's gift as a member of the choir at St. Alphonsus Rock Church in St. Louis for years. Gracie's rendition of Ave Maria in Italian filled the soul and brought tears to your eyes as witness to God's Grace and love.

After receiving her master's degree in nursing, Gracie taught public health at St. Louis University while raising two rambunctious children, Gerard and Graquel Hutchinson, and often playing mother/big sister to Leesa Goudeau, who is 21 years younger. While Gracie is survived by her children, sister, grandsons Alex and James, nieces Dominique and Alexis, she was family in spirit to countless friends and loved ones. She has joined her grandson, Shaun and her mother, Doris in Heaven.

Interment will be in Bellevue Memorial Park.
