



Mr. Victor Aloysius Green

June 19, 1933 - August 25, 2021

VICTOR ALOYSIUS GREEN, affectionately known as “Pete, Big Pete, Uncle Pete”, was born at home on June 19, 1933 to Aloysius “Doug” Green and Victoria (Mercier) Green in Arnaudville (Prairie Basse), Louisiana. He was the youngest of five siblings. He departed this life surrounded by his wife and children on August 25, 2021 in his home.

Victor was a devout Catholic who started and ended each day with prayer, devotion and the Holy Rosary, a prayer practice that undoubtedly strengthened and sustained him throughout his entire life.

Victor and Jeanette both attended St. Peter Claver High School in Grand Coteau, Louisiana. In 1957 he was united in Holy Matrimony with Jeanette Elizabeth (Etienne) Green. He fathered five children whom he loved very much: Marie, Marsha, Angela, Martin and Trent. He was a faithful husband, a loving father and a wonderful uncle who was very supportive of all members of his family.

Victor was a humble and hardworking man with a quiet spirit, generous nature and an unmatched work ethic. He was a self-taught man who loved working with his hands. He had a gift for being able to assemble, repair or improve upon anything he touched, be it a home repair, home construction, building maintenance or gardening.

In 1969 he relocated his family from Grand Coteau, Louisiana to The Bronx, New York. In 1970 he began employment at Beth Abraham Hospital as a Trades Helper, he was responsible for repairing medical equipment

and building services. He was a proud member of both the 1199 SEIU (Service Employees International Union) and the 32BJ Building Workers Union. He helped many young, and even some seasoned, Trades Helpers to perfect their skills. In addition to his day job at a very busy hospital, he was also the Superintendent on site at 2541 Olinville Avenue where he was responsible for the maintenance and repair of a 45 unit apartment building and on-call to hundreds of tenants. He was loved and respected by all of his coworkers and supervisors at Beth Abraham Hospital and all of his tenants, neighbors and friends in the Allerton/Olinville community.

Victor genuinely loved helping people in any way he could. While living in New York he opened his home to many friends and coworkers who were in need of housing and he helped many of his relatives to relocate to New York in order to better provide for themselves and their families.

After 27 years of employment at Beth Abraham Hospital, Victor retired in 1997 and returned home to Louisiana to live in Opelousas. He enjoyed his retirement and when he wasn't traveling back and forth to New York to spend time with family there, he looked forward to working side by side with his friend and nephew-in-law, Mr. Paul Amos, on some home repair, yard work or construction project.

Victor's greatest delight was in spending time with family and encouraging and supporting the lives and accomplishments of his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Victor leaves to mourn and cherish his memories, his lovingly devoted wife of 64 years, Jeanette E. (Etienne) Green; two daughters, Marsha Green and Angela Green both of The Bronx, NY; one son, Trent Love of Opelousas, LA; five grandchildren, Vanessa Washington, Mark Washington, Jr., Terrence Roker, Clayton Roker and Victoria Green; 1 great granddaughter, Arya Roker; two sisters, Beatrice Hamilton and Mabel Smith both of Port Arthur, TX; one brother, John Green of Sunset, LA; one Sister/Cousin, Mrs. Mrytle Lewis of Grand Coteau, LA and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and dear friends.

Victor was preceded in death by his parents, Aloysius "Doug" Green and Victoria (Mercier) Green; his brother, Joseph Lee Green; his daughter, Marie Esperanza Green; and his son, Martin Victor Green.

Funeral services will be held at 11:00 AM Friday, September 3, 2021 at Holy Ghost Catholic Church in Opelousas, LA. Visitation will begin at 9:00 AM at Holy Ghost Catholic Church.

Interment will be in St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Cemetery in Grand Coteau, LA. Rev. Lambert Lein, S.V.D. will officiate the Mass of Christian burial.
